What a lovely start we have had to Term 3!

On the first day back, we welcomed Miss Musarra to our Early Childhood class. She settled in very quickly and has been doing wonderful things with the students. They have been making great progress with their reading and writing – even the Kindy kids are learning their initial sounds! I'm sure that everyone who saw them perform at the assembly this week would have been impressed with their confidence and concentration as they performed their Talk for Writing performance about the little green dinosaur who lost its mother.

Term 3 is usually busy, busy, busy, with loads of interruptions, but this year, there has been lots of time for teaching and learning and we can all see the students' progress. We did have one beautiful incursion where students learned about protection of the magnificent black cockatoo species which have suffered greatly from habitat loss. They learned about the importance of planting trees to provide food for the birds, and how volunteers are providing them with nesting boxes because we no longer have enough ancient trees with holes big enough for them to nest in.

We also visited Mt Lesueur National Park for our annual walk with ranger Tyson Isles. Ranger Tyson is fascinated by flowers and geology and loves sharing his knowledge with the children. The teachers love seeing the children enjoying the bush, showing initiative and resilience as they try out new skills and manage tricky situations by themselves. They always come home exhausted, but proud of their achievements.

Tuesday 20 th August 8pm – 10pm	The power of positive parenting (under 12 years) Children of all ages need a safe, secure and loving environment to do well. This seminar will discuss children's behaviour, how to create a safe, interesting and positive learning environment, how to use assertive discipline, and taking care of yourself as a parent.
Tuesday 27 th August 8pm – 10pm	Promoting self-esteem (pre-schoolers, primary schoolers and teens) As children grow up they form views of themselves as a person, their value as an individual and how good they are at doing things. This view of their self- worth is called self-esteem. This session will help you encourage your child to be confident and develop healthy self-esteem.
Tuesday 3 rd September 8pm – 10pm	Learning to separate (toddlers and pre-schoolers) All children have to learn to cope with temporary separations from their parents. Shyness around new people and anxiety about separation from parents is common in toddlers and pre-schoolers. This session will help you teach your child to be comfortable around others and calmly separate from you, into the care of another trusted adult/caregiver.
Tuesday 10 th September 7pm – 9.30pm	Fear-Less: Supporting children with anxiety (6-14 years) Everyone feels anxious at times, even children and teenagers. But anxiety may cause distress and get in the way of life. This seminar will help parents to understand how anxiety works, how to manage your child's anxiety effectively and teach your child new coping skills.
Tuesday 17 th September 8pm – 10pm	Learning to use the toilet (toddlers and pre-schoolers) Teaching children to use the toilet independently can be challenging for parents. This workshop will provide tips on when your child may be ready, the skills needed to use the toilet, and some common behavioural issues related to using the toilet. This workshop is suitable for parents of children with neurotypical development and does not address any medical problems related to using the toilet.









36th Annual ENEABBA CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS Friday, 26th July 2024

The 2024 Eneabba Cross Country Championships was held at the Eneabba Golf Course on Friday, 26th July 2024. Many thanks to Robyn Patmore and Jessica Elliot for their organisation and co-ordination of the event; Vickie Lewis for setting up the course; Tim Davies & Eneabba Golf Club, for ensuring that our track was safe and in excellent condition; thank you to all the volunteers on the day including Carnamah Shire staff and Councillor Con Kikeros, Eneabba SES members, Iluka staff, Eneabba community members and parents from participating schools.

The Eneabba Cross Country Championships, now in its 36th year, is a tribute to the Eneabba community including the school, parents and groups who all contribute to this great event that showcases the talents, athleticism and sportsmanship of young people from all over the Midwest.

Competitors this year came from as far away as Perenjori in the north, Dandaragan in the south, Moora in the east and Dongara in the west. The event attracted 275 primary and secondary school competitors from 16 schools. The Eneabba Cross Country caters for students in individual age groups starting at Year 3 and under running 1000 metres through to Year 10 and over students running 2500 metres. Although we had early showers during set up, the weather cleared for this year's cross country and there were no records broken.

Feedback that has been received has been extremely positive. It is fantastic to see so many schools join us again this year, and we look forward to seeing them in 2025.
