Kindy Health Screening

Tara Spencer, our school nurse, will be here to do the kindy health screenings on Monday. Parents do not attend these screenings. They are quick eye/ear checks and children are often distracted, giving inaccurate results, if parents are around. Tara will contact you if there are any issues picked up with your child's vision or hearing. If you don't hear from her, then there is nothing she needs to tell you about.

These screenings are only quick checks and they only screen for distance vision, not close up or any other vision issues. If you have any worries about your child's vision, please make an appointment with an optometrist. Vision checks are covered by Medicare.
